About

Almost every industry and sector involves driving, transport and logistics. The driving sector is split into four functions:

Passenger Transport

Buses, trams, underground, taxi, light rail and trains.

Logistics

Freight transportation, maritime/port operations, postal/courier services, warehousing, storage and handling.

Vehicles

Includes fork-lift trucks and pickers as they require competence and a license to operate the vehicles.

Haulage

Heavyweight vehicles carrying large loads of products, equipment and produce over long distances.
