### Cleaning Services

#### About

The cleaning sector is generally divided into four separate functions:

#### Industrial

Industrial cleaning is the act of cleaning hazardous areas in industrial facilities such as factories, warehouse and power plants.

#### Commercial

Commercial cleaning is attributed to cleaning services for businesses such as offices, shops, bars, restaurants, care/residential homes, hospitals, hotels and schools.

#### Household

Household cleaning is when a member of the public contracts a self-employed cleaner on an hourly basis to clean their home.

#### Roles available

Domestic cleaning is similar to household cleaning but on a larger scale due to the size of the premises, and may require the use of heavier, industrial products and methods for getting things clean.

##### Cleaning Supervisor


##### Area Cleaning Supervisor
